CRAFT: PEAK-A-BOO CHICKS

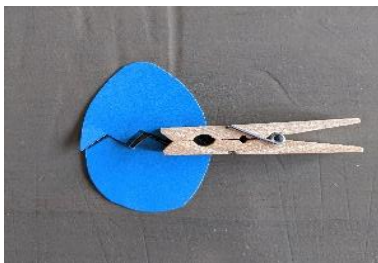
Materials

- Clothespin
- Construction Paper
- Markers or Paint
- Glue
- Scissors



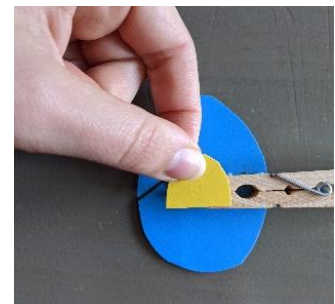
Instructions

1. Using your construction paper (or cardboard), cut out an egg shape
2. Using a pencil on the back of your cut-out egg, draw a zig zag line. Cut along this line so that your egg is now in two pieces



3. Place the egg pieces upside down and put some glue on the clothespin ends where you'll be attaching it to the egg. You'll want your egg pieces to go about as far as the metal piece. Press the clothespin onto the egg pieces.

4. Using another piece of paper, cut out a little thumb print shape that will be your chick. Use any colour of paper, or colour your chick in!

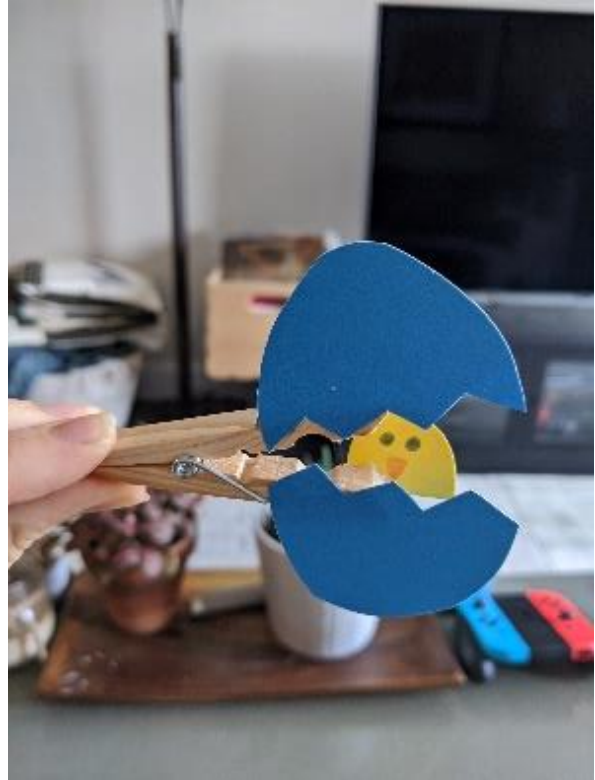

5. Use markers or pens to draw a beak and eyes on to your chick
6. Before you glue your chick down, open your clothespin and hold your chick to the back of the clothespin where you will be able to see it when the egg is open. Once you have found that spot, hold it there, flip your clothespin over, and glue your chick to that spot on the bottom clothespin
7. Make as many chicks in as many different colours as you like!

CRAFT: SOCK BUNNIES

Materials

- Sock
- Scissors
- Rice (or any dried pantry item)
- Elastics
- Markers
- Ribbon (or fabric of any kind)
- Glue
- Pom Pom (or crumpled paper, cotton ball(s), tissue paper)



Instructions

1. Fill you sock with rice. Using a funnel make filling the sock easier. The amount of rice you use will depend on the size of sock you have, but we estimate about 1 to 2 cups of rice.

2. Tie off your sock with two elastics – one to make the body and one to make the head. Make your body a bigger portion than the head



3. Draw eyes, a nose, whiskers, and teeth on the head of your bunny.
4. Use a fun piece of fabric or ribbon to tie around the neck of your bunny to make them fancy
5. Colour in a patch on the body of your bunny to create a belly

6. Cut the top half of the sock above the head in half to create ears. You can snip around the halves of the sock to create ear shapes or whatever shape you choose!
7. And what is a bunny without a fluffy tail! Attach a cotton ball, pom pom, coloured crumpled up piece of paper – really anything you have that you can imagine to be a tail! – to the back of your bunny to finish our project!
