

# GOODTIMES AT HOME

## MOVING WORM ON A LEAF

### Materials

- Toilet paper
- Straw or paper cut and glued as small cylinder
- Glue
- Cardboard paper
- Wooden skewer or pencil



1. Take a strip of toilet paper (1 square is enough) and roll it over a skewer/pencil
2. Glue the end of the toilet paper to itself so it stays in a long cylinder shape – toilet paper is still on the skewer
3. After the glue dries, while the toilet paper is still on the skewer, bunch up the toilet paper by pushing both ends of the toilet paper cylinder inwards, this creates your worm!
4. Cut out a leaf shape and make grooves in the leaf by placing the wooden skewer under the leaf and putting pressure on either side of the skewer. You can also decorate the leaf with markers.
5. Take toilet paper off straw, fold both ends in a little so they become flat and can be glued to the skewer/straw
6. Cut a small section of straw off (1/2-1 inch) and feed it onto the wooden skewer  
Note: if you don't have straws in the house, take a piece of paper, roll it and tape/glue it to stay in a cylindrical shape, cut so that the length is no longer than an inch and the skewer or pencil can fit through it with ease
7. Glue one end of the toilet paper worm to the end of the skewer and the other end to the closer end of the straw that is on the skewer
8. Glue the bottom of the straw onto the leaf
9. Decorate the worm with a marker
10. Skewer should move freely through straw and make your bug move!!
