Matthew's Story



We are delighted to share <u>Matthew's Story</u> with you.

Matthew is a Camp Goodtimes alumnus who was given a 90% chance of survival when he was diagnosed with brain cancer at just 16 years old. The same diagnosis just 10 years earlier would have been terminal. Investments into life-saving research led to this remarkable change in outcome, and programs like Camp Goodtimes provided community and connection to Matthew during his cancer experience.



Breaking Borders Update

"Earlier this spring our 2023 Breaking Borders Cohort embarked on their Sea Kayaking adventure in Tofino! Since last fall, our Breaking Borders cohort have been meeting virtually once a month to engage in sessions that covered topics such as communication, team work, self-discovery, and ultimately planning for this self-directed outdoor adventure!

Our Breaking Borders program brings together a group of young adults aged 20 to 25 who have had a cancer diagnosis to get out of their comfort zone, gain self-confidence, and find support through planning and embarking on a multi-day wilderness expedition.
